Undersheriff Bisland Graduates from 51st Chief Executive Seminar

Undersheriff Jack Bisland, second in command at the Flagler County Sheriff's Office, attended the 51st Chief Executive Seminar in Tallahassee, Florida, and graduated on Wednesday.

The Chief Executive Seminar is a program conducted by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for the chief executive in criminal justice agencies. On a limited basis, those designated to act in the absence of the chief executive are invited to attend, as was the case with Undersheriff Bisland.

This is an exceptional and widely esteemed educational experience. The class met for three separate sessions, each one week long, over the course of three months. Each session focused on the role of a leader.

Undersheriff Bisland began his law enforcement career in 1978. He has served in many agencies including the City of Longwood Police Department, the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration, and the FDLE. After retiring from his law enforcement career, he began a career in the private sector as the vice president of a national security provider before moving on to work for the State Attorney's Office in the 7th Judicial Circuit of Florida. When Sheriff Staly was elected Sheriff of Flagler County, he appointed Bisland to Undersheriff.
