Flagler Sheriff's Inmate Work Crew Fills Sandbags for **Residents in Preparation for Hurricane Dorian**

As Florida prepares for the impacts of Hurricane Dorian this Labor Day weekend, Sheriff Rick Staly has deployed the Flagler County Jail Inmate Work Crew to Malacompra Park, 115 Malacompra Road in the Hammock area of Palm Coast, to help fill sandbags for residents. There are plenty of sand bags available at this location.

"If you are in need of sand bags and would like assistance in filling the bags and loading them into your vehicle, the Inmate Work Crew is here to help," Sheriff Staly said. "The crew will be available until the county's supply of sand and sandbags runs out."
