## Inmate Transported to Hospital

An inmate at the Sheriff Perry Hall Inmate Detention Facility was transported to the hospital Monday night after exhibiting medical concerns to the jail medical team.

Inmate Medical Staff were preparing to transport Anthony Fennick, 23, to AdventHealth by ambulance when he suffered a medical episode. He is now in critical condition.

Flagler County Sheriff's Detectives are currently investigating to determine the circumstances surrounding the sudden onset of symptoms.

"Our medical team screens and evaluates every inmate at the detention facility," Chief Steve Cole said. "The medical team is available to inmates at their request. They reacted as soon as the medical episode was reported."

Sheriff Rick Staly implemented 24 hour contracted medical services in 2018.

Fennick was sentenced to 300 days in the county jail on January 9, 2019, following a Violation of Probation felony charge for Unlawful Possession of a Controlled Substance and Burglary of an Unoccupied Conveyance.
