The Flagler County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) is planning for increased patrols over the Memorial Day holiday weekend. The increased law enforcement presence will focus on seatbelt, speed, and aggressive driving enforcement along with countywide impaired driving and boating enforcement.

The full-time Marine and Beach patrol along with C.O.P. volunteers will keep watch over the waterways to promote boater safety and deter Boating Under the Influence (BUI).

"While the state is beginning to open back up from the COVID-19 pandemic, we are expecting people will be ready to spend time outdoors during this long weekend," Sheriff Rick Staly said. "If you plan to drink, plan to have a sober driver or captain.
