Fugitive Edgewater Woman Wanted in Several Counties for Grand Theft Arrested by FCSO after Shoplifting

Subject has Lengthy History of Theft Across the State

BUNNELL, FL – On January 10, 2023, FCSO deputies responded to a Palm Coast business for a shoplifting in progress. The reporting party stated that an adult white female with blonde hair had passed all points of sale and ran from the loss prevention employees when confronted at the front door without paying for any items. The reporting party also provided a vehicle description to FCSO Communications who relayed the information to responding deputies.

The reporting party stated that the female had placed several items of unpaid merchandise into her shopping cart and then traveled to another aisle where she placed the merchandise into the store's plastic shopping bags. The female then traveled to the front of the store where loss prevention employees confronted the female as she was attempting to leave without paying. She then left the cart of merchandise and fled in her vehicle. The merchandise was valued at over \$1,100.

Deputies located a vehicle matching the description at the intersection of US1 and SR100 W and also observed a driver who matched the suspect. Deputies conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the driver who was later identified as Tracy Curley of Edgewater, FL. Curley stated to deputies that she had planned to leave the store without paying for the merchandise and that she was then planning to sell the merchandise online.

Upon further investigation into Curley's identity, it was discovered that she was a fugitive and wanted in Broward County, FL, and Orange County, FL, on Grand Theft charges. Curley was charged with

Shoplifting – Grand Theft (\$750-\$5,000) and the out-of-county warrants. She was transported to the Sheriff Perry Hall Inmate Detention Facility and later released after posting \$7,000 bond. Curley has a lengthy criminal history including many theft- and narcotics-related charges. She has previously been convicted of Grand Theft in 2012 (Orange County, FL) and 2018 (Monroe County, FL). She has had 21 felony charges with 5 convictions.

“This woman has made a career out of stealing from businesses and then selling the merchandise online,” said Sheriff Rick Staly. “Thank you to the loss prevention employees of the store who saw something and said something! Another fugitive made the mistake of coming to Flagler County to commit a crime. We hope this woman will steer clear of Flagler County from now on.”
