18-45706	Disturbance with Weapons	Cypress Point Parkway	RP1 reported after a road rage incident, the other vehicle (a white Escalade) involved followed him into the Circle K parking lot. The RP stated that an unknown male occupant approached his vehicle and knocked on his driver side window. RP stated because he was in fear for his safety, he displayed a pocket knife to the male. The male then lifted his shirt displaying an unknown firearm tucked in his waistband. RP advised the male did not pull the firearm out of his waistband or touch the firearm with his hands during the incident. The male then returned to his vehicle and left the area without further incident. The RP could not provide any additional information in reference to the Escalade.

According to the reporting students, the alleged student did not threaten to harm anyone or destroy any property. Contact was made with the student, and his parents, at his home residence and it was discovered the student had no weapons or access to weapons.

The owner, V1, screamed and the dog charged at her. O1 was in fear of being attacked, so she discharged one 9mm round from a Glock 19 at the dog, but missed; the dogs then ran off. O1 stated that this was not the first time the dogs had gotten out and the white Pittbull had previous tried to bite her friend. The round appeared to go into the ground. The adjacent homes were checked and there were no signs of damage. Animal Control was contacted and the dog was located uninjured.
