Transcript below:			

Good Afternoon, I am your Sheriff Rick Staly with an Update on Hurricane Dorian.

At this point, I think we can all breathe a sigh of relief and be grateful that we dodged a bullet. The effects felt in Flagler County by Hurricane Dorian were much less than expected and thankfully Flagler County sustained very minor damage overall.

This morning, reports showed that Flagler County had about 1,700 homes without power. There are some downed trees and fallen branches but overall no serious structural damage.

At noon today, I met with Flagler County Emergency Services and local officials and we have decided to lift the curfew and evacuation orders for Hurricane Evacuation Zones A, B, and F.

The shelters are already beginning to close.

Please keep in mind that strong winds and heavy rain is expected throughout Flagler County for the remainder of the day today. We would still strongly encourage anyone who does not have to be on the roads to remain indoors. There is still a potential for falling trees and branches and downed power lines.
