FCSO Searching for Spray Paint Bandits

Throughout the month of August, vandals spray painting garage doors, sides of homes, and even vehicles, have caused damage to properties throughout Flagler County. Flagler Sheriff's detectives have followed all leads in an attempt to identify the suspects. While detectives believe the graffiti is related, they do not believe it is racially motivated or gang related.

Detectives are asking residents to call law enforcement if they see anything that may be related to these crimes. They are also sending a reminder to businesses that minors are prohibited by law from purchasing aerosol spray paint until 18 years of age. Deputies have increased patrols in residential areas in an attempt to hinder this behavior from continuing.

“If you see something, say something,” Sheriff Rick Staly said. “That will be the best way for us to identify who is doing this and put a stop to it.”
