Three Suspects Arrested for Overnight Car Burglaries

Four vehicle burglaries were reported Monday morning in the Woodlands area of Palm Coast. Patrol deputies and K-9s set a perimeter to search the area. Investigators followed leads on the use of a stolen credit card and tracked purchases to the Palm Coast Wal-Mart. Investigators were able to identify the suspects based on video surveillance at Wal-Mart. Investigators made contact with three suspects and took them into custody.

Daryl Lasahy McCaskill, 11/12/1997, Brian George, 8/3/1998, and Ra'Quan Lockley, 4/9/1999, are currently being booked into the Flagler County Detention Facility for burglary of an automobile. The investigation is still active and additional charges may be added as the investigation continues.

"The men and women from our agency have been hard at work this Labor Day weekend," Sheriff Rick Staly said. "These dirtbags need to be dealt with harshly by the criminal justice system and put an end to the revolving door of the system. People work hard for their stuff and no one should steal it from them. Get a job like the rest of us," said Sheriff Staly.

Several credit cards and stolen items have been recovered. The Sheriff's Office is reminding everyone to remove valuables from vehicles and lock the doors. The majority of car burglaries occur when a vehicle is left unlocked in the driveway.

All three suspects have prior arrest histories in Flagler County. McCaskill's past charges include possession of marijuana, fleeing and eluding law enforcement, and violation of probation. George has past arrests for robbery, burglary and loitering. Lockley has faced past charges of criminal mischief, loitering, and unauthorized use of a credit card.

This is an ongoing investigation and it's possible that these suspects may be linked to additional car burglaries.
