## <u>UPDATE: Suspect Arrested, Charged with Four Counts</u> <u>of Grand Theft</u>

Kelly Ryan Campanella, DOB 3/26/1991, was arrested Friday evening and charged with four counts of grand theft over \$300.00 related to the recent trailers thefts. Campanella's truck was seen on surveillance video at a storage facility in Palm Coast. The video shows the truck entering the facility and leaving with a trailer that was later reported stolen. A thorough investigation revealed that Campanella was responsible for multiple thefts of trailers from storage facilities and properties in Flagler County. He was booked into the Flagler County Detention Facility and released on a \$10,000.00 bond.

## **Seven Stolen Trailers Recovered During Search Warrant**

on Thursday morning on Mahogany Boulevard in Bunnell. Sheriff Rick Staly was on scene as detectives executed a search warrant related to a recent rash of stolen trailers.

Through investigative leads, detectives were able to identify a suspect in the thefts who then cooperated with detectives and identified the property where the stolen trailers were located. Once on scene, seven stolen trailers were located on the property.

"This was good investigative work on the part of our detectives and patrol deputies," Sheriff Staly said. "I'm glad we were able to return the property to the rightful owners. Charges are pending on at least one suspect. This is still an active investigation."

Five of the stolen trailers have already been returned to the owners. The remaining two trailers will be returned as soon as the owners can be contacted.

Detectives have one suspect identified with charges pending. Additional suspects may be identified as the investigation continues.
