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FCSO Presents Great Kid Awards for September 2025

BUNNELL, Fla. — On Nov. 5, the Flagler County Sheriff's Office presented Sheriff Rick Staly's "Great Kid" Award to three exceptional Flagler Schools students. Investigative Services Division Chief Agustin Rodriguez and Youth Services Division Commander Jennifer Nawrocki visited the schools to present the awards for Sept. 2025 alongside school resource deputies.

The "Great Kid" Awards are presented each month during the school year to three students — one each in the elementary, middle, and high school levels — who respect their peers, help others, work hard in academics, and represent themselves and their school well. The recipients are nominated by SRDs and school employees.

"A big congratulations to these three outstanding students," said Sheriff Staly. "They were chosen as 'Great Kids' because their efforts, achievements, and attitude do not go unnoticed. We're excited to be able to honor these students and recognize them for being great kids."
